Background

East Belfast Mission has a long track record of social engagement in Inner East Belfast. We may have grown somewhat since the Newtownards Road Methodist Church soup kitchen of the 1800's, but our mission is still the same: to transform and renew East Belfast.

We have operated as a Registered Charitable Organisation since 1985 offering a range of services to meet the needs of children, young people, people who are homeless and/or unemployed, the elderly and families.

Today we are one of the largest community organisations in the area, employing 50 staff and supported by a volunteer team of more than 50 people.

We work in partnership with a range of charities, organisations and churches and have a track record of strategic partnership in social care. This includes long-standing relationships with:

- Oaklee Housing Association and the Northern Ireland Housing Executive in work with homeless people,
- Department for Employment and Learning and Belfast City Council in work with the unemployed, and
- South & East Belfast Health & Social Services Trust in work with the elderly.

The various services and programmes offered include:

- **Homelessness service - Hosford House** - a hostel for homeless people
- **Employability services - Stepping Stone** - support and training for people who are unemployed
- **Social Economy projects** - re:store - charity shops - Mission Café
- **Meals on wheels**
- **Youth & Community Work**
- **and a Worshipping Congregation**

East Belfast Mission Shops

In October 2005 we opened a very unique furniture store. Located in a former cash & carry warehouse on the Newtownards Road, it is believed to be the biggest charity shop in Northern Ireland.

Alongside our clothes shop, also based on the Newtownards Road, we provide nearly new clothing and furniture to the people of the area. All profits from the shops are used by the Mission to subsidise the social programme.

Financial assistance from the Community Waste Innovation Fund will enable the Mission develop its furniture operation under the 'Recycle and Resale of Furniture and Electrical Goods' project. As part of this initiative the Mission will receive funding to develop three new furniture stores over the next three years. These stores will be branded re:store logo and will incorporate the slogan **reduce, reuse, recycle**. The first of these stores will open in Antrim in 2007.

Aim of restore:

With the support of local councils, we aim to redirect furniture and white goods from the waste stream and sell them through EBM's Social Enterprise Project, **re:store**.
